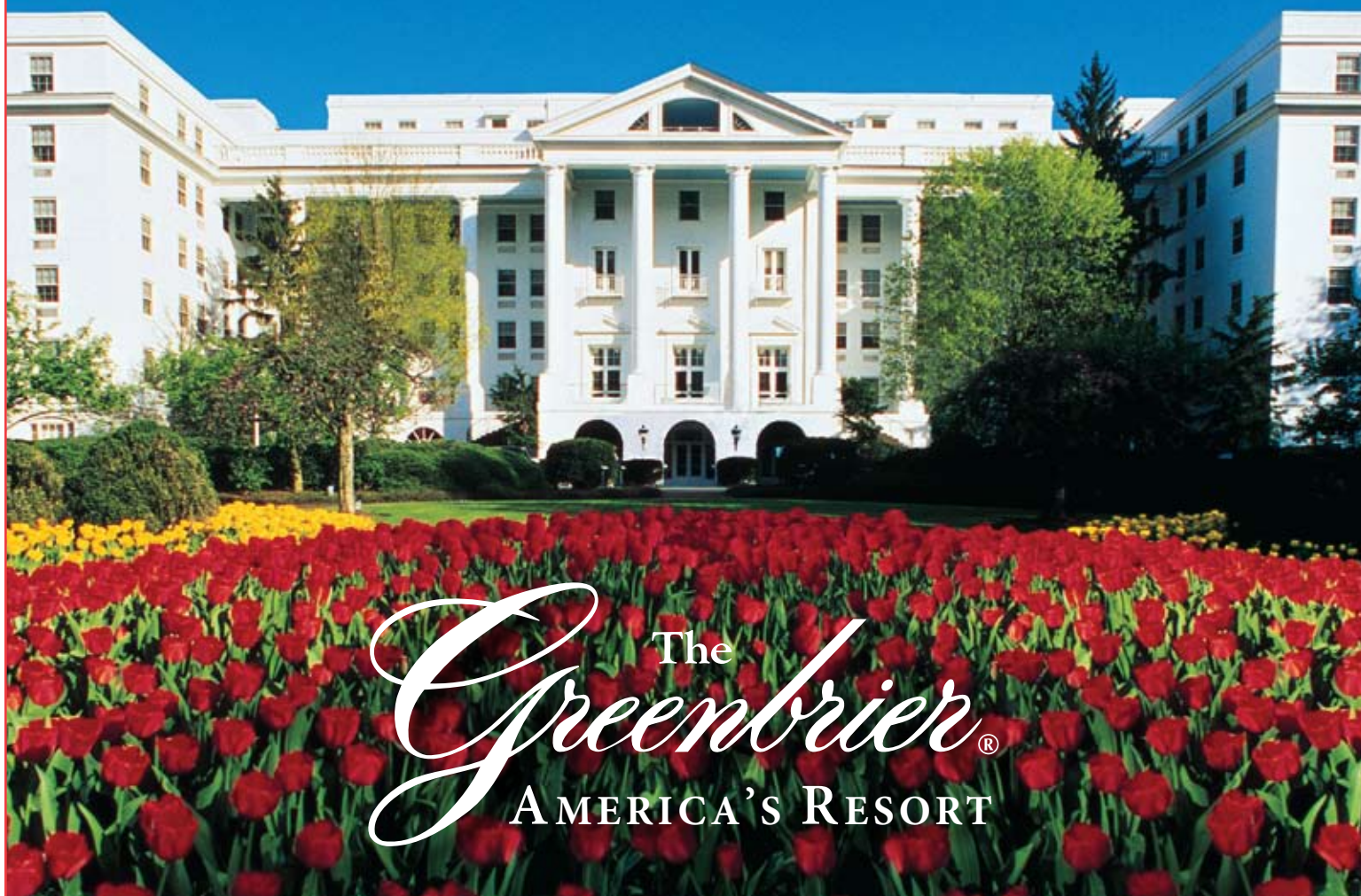

“Historic Property Preservation and Conservation Easements”



Robert S. Conte, Ph. D., Resident Historian at The Greenbrier

Robert Conte is a native of San Jose, California, earned his B.A. degree in History from Santa Clara University in 1968 and his Ph.D. in 1975 from Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Conte is responsible for establishing and maintaining the archives of The Greenbrier's historical materials, is the curator of the Presidents' Cottage Museum and gives various presentations and tours explaining the resort's two hundred year history to guests of The Greenbrier. In addition, Dr. Conte has written numerous articles for local and regional publications and contributed to newspaper articles, books and museum exhibits. He is the only full-time professional historian employed by a hotel or resort in the United States. Dr. Conte served for six years on the Board of Directors of the West Virginia Humanities Council. He currently serves, by appointment from the Governor, as the Chairman of the West Virginia Archives and History Commission and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Preservation Alliance of West Virginia as well as the Board of Directors of the Greenbrier Historical Society.



Joyce E. McConnell, Dean, WVU College of Law

Joyce E. McConnell is the William J. Maier, Jr. Dean and Thomas R. Goodwin Professor of Law of the WVU College of Law. She teaches primarily in the area of property law, natural resources, and land-use planning. She is the Chair-Elect of the Association of American Law Schools Section on Natural Resources and an executive committee member of the Section on Dean for the Law School. She became an ABA Foundation Fellow in 2009. Recently, she was appointed by the Governor to serve on the Governor's Judicial Reform Commission. Dean McConnell earned her LL.M. from Georgetown University Law Center in Advocacy. Her academic career has taken her from Georgetown's Center for Applied Legal Studies, City University of New York, University of Maryland School of Law and then to the WVU College of Law, where she became the Thomas R. Goodwin Professor of Law.

Virgil T. Helton was appointed Cabinet Secretary on October 16, 2007, by Governor Joe Manchin. As Secretary of the Department of Revenue, he oversees the following agencies: Alcohol Beverage Control Administration, Athletic Commission, Division of Banking, State Budget Office, Offices of the Insurance Commissioner, Municipal Bond Commission, Office of Tax Appeals, Racing Commission, and the State Tax Department. In his capacity as Cabinet Secretary of Revenue, he is also the State Budget Director, the Governor’s designee for the Investment Management Board and the Board of Treasury Investments, and chairs the Retail Liquor Licensing Board. Mr. Helton is a 1967 graduate of Concord University, Athens, West Virginia, and is licensed to practice as a Certified Public Accountant by the West Virginia Board of Accountancy.

Honorable Joseph A. Manchin III, Governor of WV

Joseph A. Manchin III is West Virginia’s 34th governor. Governor Manchin was elected to the House of Delegates in the WV Legislature in 1982, and the State Senate in 1986 where he served until 1996. In 2000, Manchin was elected Secretary of State of WV and in 2004 elected to his first term as Governor of WV. In 2008, he won re-election as Governor. He currently serves as president of the Council of State Governments, chairman-elect of the Southern States Energy Board, and a member of the National Governors Association’s Executive Committee. He is the immediate past chairman of the Democratic Governors Association and the Southern Governors’ Association, as well as past state co-chair of the Appalachian Regional Commission. Manchin has an undergraduate degree from WVU in information management.
